Impressive results from the Class of 2010



CCGS offers the Max Potential program as another opportunity for students to gain valuable leadership and interpersonal skills.

Max Potential is a 22 week personal leadership development program for young adults. The program offers each student their own coach, in 8 one-on-one sessions, during which the student explores their ability to lead themselves to achieve their description of success.

Head of House John Boesenberg introduces the program to Years 10-11 and interested students submit an application to Max Potential for consideration. This year, Laura Hamblin and Grace Fowles were successful in gaining entry to the program and are currently completing the components of the course.

“The time input from students is considerable, but the outcomes are very rewarding,” said Mr Boesenberg.

Participants have the opportunity to demonstrate their skills through a community service project of their own design and scope. This contribution may be, for example; providing assistance at nursing homes, teaching a sport to younger students or initiating a conservation program. Students complete their project through June and July and present it at the closing Expo.

The program is in its 4th year, and it is the first time CCGS has been involved. The 2010 program involved 24 students across 9 High Schools.
