Kirsten Brumby, the program co-ordinator, said the showcase was the 2010 Max Potential's and the students' finale.

"They get to showcase what they have learned in their own personal leadership and also display the project they have undertaken in the local community," she said.

Ms Brumby said the program gets better and better every year and the participating students have been fantastic.

"This group has been fantastic ... and diverse in terms of students and community coaches," she said.

"The group has tackled issues such as providing safe alternatives to underage drinking through to spending time with senior citizens and taking down their stories."

According to Ms Brumby the students have been upbeat and enthusiastic.

"Part of the uniqueness of Max Potential is that each individual student gets to develop their own leadership qualities, with the help of their coaches," she said.

The changes and transformations in the students is clear.

"They have gained confidence and the ability to

speak in public and gain the knowledge that they can make a difference in their own life and lives of others," Ms Brumby said.

The initiative is also planning for next year, according to Ms Brumby.

"We've got students from Willyama High School, Broken Hill High School and Menindee High School visiting the showcase and we will work with them next year," she said.

"Today gives prospective leaders from the community a chance to see if they would like to be involved next year as coaches."

One student from Willyama High School, who participated in Max Potential, April Demery, designed a fitness class at the PCYC.

She said the class runs Monday and Thursday with a gold coin donation.

"It involves boxing, cardio, strength and core work," April said.

So far April has run one class and her father has been helping her with the others.

"There has been a good turnout, at least ten people at each, and the money goes back to the PCYC," she said.

April said Max Potential had helped her become more of a leader.

"I've stepped out of my

comfort zone and it has made me more confident in myself," she said.

"I'd recommend it to anyone ... it is a worthwhile experience," April said.

Vika Pagano from Menindee High School also participated in the program by hosting a Naden Shield Rugby game.

The game was to be held between Wilcannia and Menindee and Vika said it gave the younger boys and girls an opportunity to play rugby.

Vika's coach Daniel Fusi said the game happens three times a term and they try and get community services to "jump in".

Mr Fusi said Vika was very shy and Max Potential had helped her "come out of her shell a little bit".

Max Potential has also helped Catherine Brandon, who will be performing in Los Angeles as part of the Glöe Club Australia Tour.

Catherine has been named as the first Australian Max Potential Ambassador, which is a first for Broken Hill and will be a part of the program promotion next year.

Max Potential will provide Catherine with financial assistance to help cover her costs in America.
